To: Local Agency Formation Commission

Re: LAFCO-03-04: Conducting Authority (Protest Hearing) proceedings for the Northeast Yuba City Reorganization No. 316 - A reorganization proposing to annex 233± acres to Yuba City and detachment of the property from County Service Area G. The territory is generally located north of the current city limits, east of State Highway 99, west of and including Live Oak Boulevard and extending approximately 1,200 feet north of Pease Road.

**I. STAFF'S RECOMMENDED ACTION**

Conduct a public hearing, receive written protest, close the hearing, and adopt the attached resolution if:

- A. Less than 25 percent of the registered voters in the territory have filed valid protests; and
- B. If less than 25 percent of the number of owners of land who also own at least 25 percent of the assessed value of land within the affected territory have filed valid protests.

**II. APPLICATION**

On January 22, 2004, LAFCO approved the above reorganization for annexation of 233± acres of land to the city of Yuba City, and detachment of the territory from County Service Area (CSA) "G".

On February 20, 2004, the City of Yuba City filed a request for reconsideration of Resolution No. 2004-02 adopted on January 22, 2004, asking LAFCO to reconsider the proposal due to inadequate public notice having been provided at the January meeting.

LAFCO heard the request for reconsideration at its March 25<sup>th</sup> and April 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2004, meetings and approved the request for reconsideration by adopting a new resolution (No. 2004-10). As a result, the proposal is now moving on to the conducting authority proceedings.

**III. CONDUCTING AUTHORITY PROCEEDINGS**

Government Code section 57000(b) requires your commission to act as the conducting authority for this reorganization. The conducting authority must determine whether sufficient written protests have been filed that would require the proceedings to be terminated or to approve the reorganization

subject to an election by the voters. If sufficient written protests are not submitted, then the conducting authority is required to approve the reorganization.

Your commission should conduct a public hearing to receive any protests, written or oral. In order to count as a valid protest, an oral protest must also be made in writing and filed before the end of the hearing. At the close of the hearing, your commission should render a decision based on the number of written protests received.

If at least 25 percent but less than 50 percent of the registered voters residing in the territory have filed valid protest, or if 25 percent of the number of owners of land who also own at least 25 percent of the assessed value of land within the affected territory have filed valid protest, then the reorganization must be approved subject to confirmation by the voters.

If at least 50 percent of the registered voters residing in the territory file written protests to the reorganization, then the reorganization proceedings must be terminated.

Staff has prepared a resolution for your use which assumes a sufficient number of valid protests have not been filed by the conclusion of the hearing.
